The Actor-Reality Perspective On-going research and future prospects

About the conference:

During the last decades, management models have been based on a mechanical view of human action, organisational activity and social relationships. These models deliberately avoid the fact that people have a free will and a mind of their own. This may be manifested by e.g. how employees' creativeness and initiatives are viewed as disrupting planned activities and must thus be prevented. A mechanical approach also creates a person who is motivated mainly by extrinsic motivation and intrinsic motivation is neglected. This is problematic both for organisations and individuals, since extrinsically driven people who only respond to rewards and demands made by others, cannot become active and creative problem-solvers.

The purpose of the conference is to provide possibilities to discuss perspectives opposed to mechanical management - perspectives which can be used to develop methods and practices to handle the complexity and non-linearity of organisational processes. Common to these perspectives is the assumption that members of organisations do possess creativity and problem solving skills which can be used in a constructive way in day-to-day operations and which will make organizations more competitive if the management is capable of acknowledging these abilities.

We welcome submissions of papers of different types - short papers e.g. presentation of ideas, research projects, and full conference papers in the areas of:

- governance, management and leadership
- performance measurement
- creativity and problemsolving
- knowledge and learning
- communication
- responsibility and trust
- ethics and virtues


